

How Do I Get to Salem?

Oregon State Penitentiary is located at 2605 State Street in Salem, Oregon.

From Portland: Take I-5 South toward Salem. Take Market Street Exit #256. Turn right onto Market Street NE. Take 1st left onto Hawthorne Ave NE. Turn right onto State Street. OSP is on the right.

From Springfield/Eugene: Take I-5 North toward Portland. Take State Route 22 Exit #253. Turn left on State Route 22. Turn right onto Hawthorne Ave SE. Take the 3rd left onto State Street. OSP is on the right.

Who Can Witness An Execution?

Prior to the scheduled execution date, the Superintendent invites certain people to attend and witness the execution that may include victim family members. Persons designated by the victim's family may witness the execution subject to the approval of the Superintendent and criminal history background clearance. Refer to (OAR 291-024-0020(3)).

What Should I Bring?

Witnesses must bring a current/valid photo ID card, such as a driver's license and the original letter of invitation to witness the execution.

Witnesses are encouraged to leave personal items in their car. Please note that Corrections Officers are authorized to physically search anyone who comes to the prison and search his or her belongings.

NOT PERMITTED:

- ∞Cameras or recording devices
- ∞Drugs, alcohol or tobacco products
- ∞Weapons
- ∞Cell phones or pagers

What Should I Wear?

Witnesses should dress comfortably and conservatively. Shorts, tank tops and see-through fabrics are not appropriate and may result in admission to the prison being denied. No blue denim or any other

blue clothing is allowed. Metal buttons, jewelry, underwire bras, and some shoes activate the metal detector. Please avoid wearing these items.

What Time Should I Arrive?

Victim witnesses and other family members or support persons should arrive at the designated meeting place off prison grounds, as coordinated with Victim Services, two hours prior to the scheduled execution. Only those victim witnesses who receive an official invitation will depart for pre-designated pick-up site. Victim witnesses will then be escorted to a designated staging area on prison grounds and will be required to show picture identification and the original letter of invitation. Within two hours of the execution, victim witnesses will be escorted to the institution. Upon arrival, they will be checked into the institution and escorted to the victim witness waiting area.

Just prior to the execution, victim witnesses will be accompanied to the witness room by OSP staff to witness the execution. Other family members and support persons will remain at the off-prison grounds site until the witnesses return. Following the execution, staff will escort victim witnesses back to the designated staging area on prison grounds. If witnesses wish to make a statement to the media, they will be

escorted to the media center at this time.

Do I Have to Talk to the Media?

Victim witnesses are under no obligation to speak with the media. While there are media representatives in the execution viewing area, they are not permitted to speak with the witnesses. An opportunity for victim witnesses to make a statement to the media will be provided in the Media Center. In this case, it may be beneficial to prepare a written statement in advance.

Who Will Be There for Support?

Victim Services and chaplain staff will be available throughout the execution process. Additional support person(s) from a local county victim assistance program or other victim advocacy program may remain at the off-prison grounds waiting area until victim witness return from the execution.

Can I Change My Mind?

Not every family member of victims wants to witness an execution. It is important to know that it is your choice.

Victim witnesses may decide not to witness the execution right up until the last minute. If witnesses do change their mind prior to arrival at the prison, they are asked to contact Victim Services as soon as possible.
